As a principal faculty member, the successful candidate will assist with the development, content delivery and assessment of didactic and clinical curriculum. All principal faculty participate in the continuous review, analysis, and evaluation of the program's success. Other duties include academic advising, service and professional activities. 20% release time is available to pursue clinical work or scholarship.

Responsibilities:

1. Serve as course director or co-director as needed for program
2. Advise students
3. Contribute to collecting and managing data to track learning outcomes for students and performance outcomes for the program
4. Assist the program director with the continuous development, review, planning, outcomes evaluation, and general effectiveness of the PA program
5. Assist the program director with continuous program review and evaluation, curriculum revision, evaluation of course syllabi and lesson plans for the didactic curriculum
6. Proctor exams and provide remediation as necessary
7. Participate in program meetings, college committees, and state and national organizations
8. Coordinate, review and revise academic policies and procedures as needed

- Minimum three years of clinical practice experience
- Current NCCPA certification with eligibility for licensure in the State of Missouri
- Demonstrated strong interpersonal skills
- Demonstrated strong oral/written communications skills
- Demonstrated course management skills
- Demonstrated proficiency with learning management systems, office software technology
- Commitment to PA profession and education
- Demonstrated strong collaboration, leadership, and mediation skills
